

## WHAT DRIVES OUR CHURCH?

During summer some of us had the opportunity of enjoying vacations. I went with my wife to La Paz, Bolivia, where I served as pastor and missionary for twelve years (1981-1993). In Bolivia I met my wife and God gave me family and the privilege of serving thousands of people. As we arrived some of our friends and church members learned about our presence there. The word spread around and we got many invitations. People gathered in groups in homes and churches. We enjoyed their hospitality as we listened to their testimonies of God goodness through the years. We noticed that there were many people that we didn't meet before. We asked to those people that we knew, "who are they?" They answered, "they are the fruit of what we learned from both of you: we must seek out and save the lost in the name of Jesus". All of the sudden I realized that what is needed to drive a congregation forward is passion to seek out and make disciples for Jesus Christ. What drives in congregation forward in their mission even in the midst of difficulties is neither its financial resources nor a charismatic personality. What drives a congregation is its passion to seek out and make disciples.

During the 2009 Greater New Jersey Annual Conference in Pennsylvania we had Rev. Adam Hamilton as our invited speaker. Rev. Hamilton is the senior pastor of the The Resurrection UMC in Kansas. He started his ministry with four people in 1990. Nowadays every weekend over 8,000 gather for worship. In one of his Bible studies during annual conference he affirmed "Jesus said that his driving passion was to "seek out and to save the lost." If this was Jesus' driving passion, it must be our driving passion". Certainly, a congregation that has passion to go out and save the lost will experience growth in all aspects. The opposite is also true. When a congregation is not passionate about seeking out and saving the lost it will decline. Quite often we let so many other concerns take over a congregation. We spent so much time and energy neither enriching nor nourishing our passion to save the lost but on so many other futile and hallow issues. There were many people around Jesus who focused on trivial and futile issues and tried to deflect Jesus from his passion to save the lost. Jesus didn't let that happen.

As a congregation we must ponder the question, what drives our congregation? We must be honest and truthful. We need to consider if our decisions and actions are about "seeking out and saving the lost". We must focus on what really matters before God. We must reaffirm ,renew and nourish our passion. We must not let anything or anyone distract or deter us from "seeking out and saving the lost" . By grace we have received by grace we must give. If we value grace, we will give grace to others. We are challenge by Jesus' example and model. Let us join with those who are passionate about "seeking out and saving the lost" and by example bring every person together for ministry. Paul the Apostle clearly stated "Your attitude should be the same as that of Christ Jesus" Philippians 2:5. I am certain that a congregation with passion to seek out and save the lost will experience God blessing in all matters and will see God's power and grace convey in all areas of each and every disciple.

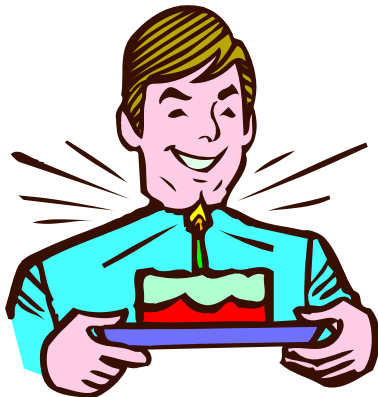

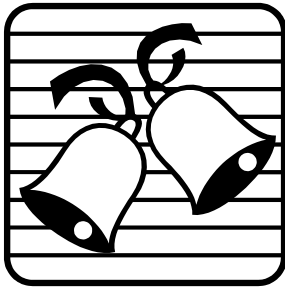

Please notify Rev. Ramos if you will be able to attend and which one will be best for you.

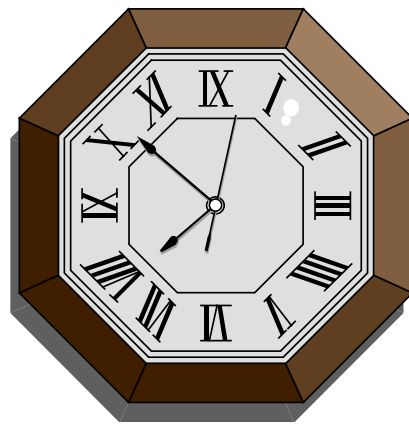
